\*SLPA 305 Childhood Language Development (New to District)

The American-Speech-Language-Hearing Association (ASHA) is the national governing body within the industry of speech pathology. ASHA is currently creating a national examination for the speech-language pathology assistant (SLPA) and is anticipated to have a section on childhood language development. This course is being created to provide more in-depth learning opportunities for the ECE student, the SLPA student, the student in human development and the registered SLPA within the realm of the childhood language development. It will allow for the SLPA student to be more prepared for the forthcoming national SLPA examination as well as employment in the field. It will also prepare people who work in the field of early childhood (caring for children and/or educating children) with an in-depth look at the language development process.
